

Castaway Corner is back... and shortly Survivor will be too! Season 47 premiers September 18th on CBS.



### THE PERFECT SUMMER SANDWICH

It's true! I've created the perfect summer sandwich in honor of one of my favorite childhood movies

Paul Blart: Mall Cop

You've all heard of the classic BLT...
but have you heard of the BLART?
Bacon, lettuce, avocado, radish, tomato.
Does it get any better than that?
I think not!



#### HOW TO:

Turn on oven to 400° and place tray of bacon in for 8 minutes. No need to preheat. While bacon is cooking, slice tomato and radish (thinly sliced is my preference.) The lettuce and avocado are pretty self explanatory. If you're feeling fancy, thinly slice up some red onion and pre-season your avocado in a bowl for easy spreading later. After 8 minutes, flip bacon over and add your bread of choice on top of bacon to toast in the grease. Cook the bacon for another 4 minutes and remove.

You can turn off the oven now, and let the bread toast to your desired crisp. Flip the bread over to get an even toasting.

Once your bread is ready, its time for assembly. BLART structure is important. Start with a mayo spread on one piece of bread. Season with salt, black and red pepper. Then proceed with tomato, bacon and lettuce. Finally on the top piece of bread, spread the avocado. Now season the avocado if you did not do so prior. and then finish with the radish. now take this piece of bread and place it on top to complete your BLART! ENJOY!
